This year we entered into partnership dialogue with the City of Port St. Lucie and with St. Lucie Public Schools to launch an innovative community-driven approach to public art. Our partnerships continued with the Oxbow Eco-Center's Procession of the Species, which will provide a catalyst for community focus around environment and sustainability issues in a high profile, fun way. And we began work with the City of Fort Pierce, engaging Sunrise Theatre staff with the significant issues faced by theatres today.

We have seen the Board of St. Lucie County Commissioners demonstrate recognition and commitment to the benefits the arts bring to communities with their ongoing support for the building of this county-wide Local Arts Agency. We have also seen the building of a resilient Board of Directors which now comprises local civic and business minded community leaders.

It has been said that for art to be compelling and effective it should convey an element of drama. This year has not lacked for a sense of drama. This year we sawthe Florida State Legislature enact an extraordinary 93% cut to the funding of arts and culture. So we challenge you to advocate for the return of funding to levels that ensure programs which contribute to quality of life.



DIGITAL HUB

WEBSITE

Following broad consultation with the arts and cultural sector. to explore the needs of artists, organizations, and educators, we aggregated these anecdotal requirements and aligned them with the findings from previous public workshops.



ONLINE TOOLS

In May 2018, our Communications Manager commenced the development of St. Lucie Cultural Alliance's marketing and public relations strategies. Significant progress was made with the launch of the digital hub, improving search engine optimization, and growing social media engagement.

E-mail campaigns that promote local arts and cultural events as well as opportunities for artists also began and open and click rates in the e-blasts consistently surpass the industry average.

We are collaborating with our partners, including St. Lucie County, St. Lucie Tourism Division, and local municipalities to cross-promote social media campaigns. Examples include high-profile events like Procession of the Species and the Rusty Wiles exhibit opening at the Backus Museum during the Firefighters Challenge, as well as opportunities for artists such as the Call for Art at Port St. Lucie City Hall.

ART IN PUBLIC PLACES

Public art, temporary or permanent, offers a sense of place, to better understand where we live, work, and play.

It is an opportunity for vibrant communities to celebrate a positive image and be more engaged. It may also offer fascinating experiences, turning an ordinary location into a destination for visitors and residents.

Having worked through a lengthy process to review the St. Lucie County Public Art Ordinance, the proposed amendments now await approval from the Board of County Commissioners. Upon approval, the public art dollars will, once again, become available for the Art in Public Places Program in our community.

PARTNERSHIPS

ST. LUCIE TOURISM DIVISION

St. Lucie Cultural Alliance is collaborating with Visit St. Lucie, St. Lucie County's Tourism Division on cultural destination initiatives. For example, we are developing an interactive map of public art, including murals and sculpture. SLCA is also participating in Visit St. Lucie's Share Your St. Lucie campaign, and cross-promoting events, local museums, theatres, and other cultural assets.



St. Lucie Cultural Alliance is partnering with the City of Port St. Lucie on a number of projects. We are assisting the City with their Art in Public Places program in a variety of ways – helping develop the artist selection process for the Selvitz Road roundabout and facilitating an artist residency at Parkway Elementary as part of the design process for the public artwork that will be installed in the roundabout.

SUNRISE THEATRE

St. Lucie Cultural Alliance is assisting Sunrise Theatre during a time of transition. We have explored, with Sunrise staff, ways they might grow their audiences and St. Lucie Cultural Alliance is working with them to develop a five-year strategic plan to ensure continued growth and sustainability.

OXBOW ECO-CENTER

SLCA is currently collaborating with Oxbow Eco-Center to make the 2018 Procession of the Species a high point in the county cultural calendar. This community event is a celebration of nature through public expressions of art in the form of costumes, large puppets and human-propelled floats. SLCA staff has assisted with planning and promotion of the event as well as facilitating the participation of local schools and the artistic community.

NETWORKING

In July 2018, St. Lucie Cultural Alliance presented its first networking mixer at Port St. Lucie Botanical Gardens for members, friends and stakeholders.

We plan to present these events on a quarterly basis and look forward to welcoming new supporters and members to the cultural community.

During the coming year, St. Lucie Cultural Alliance will launch a series of professional capacity building workshops that will present attendees with new ideas, new skills and hopefully enable them to gain effectiveness and improve ways of working. Through these workshops the intent is to raise the programmatic bar and build capacity of cultural organizations and artists to present ever more compelling events and attractions for residents and visitors to St. Lucie County.

We also plan to present hands-on technical workshops for artists, such as Creating Better Photography of Your Artwork.

EDUCATION

SLCA is collaborating with community partners on arts in education initiatives.

Great arts education opportunities for the entire county are essential for a vibrant and sustainable arts and cultural sector that serves our schools and communities.

For this reason, SLCA education initiatives channel existing resources within the arts sector for the benefit of students, families and educators.

In the context of the 2018 Procession of the Species, SLCA partnered with Oxbow Eco-Center and Ibex Puppetry to present a free workshop for teachers and artists. Participants learned how to create and perform with puppets to be used in the parade.

SLCA is also working with Parkway Elementary in the implementation of an artist's residency as part of the design process for the public art piece that will be installed in the Selvitz Road roundabout.

TEACHING ARTISTS

SLCA is leading the creation of a local network of professional teaching artists.

Each member of the roster has been approved through an application process that assures each participant meets the requirements. Teaching artists are professionals who are able to achieve a balance between artistic proficiency and effective instruction.
